That General Davidson signed his the said (Miller's)
Commissiion when he was appointed Captain, and that
the said Commissiion was burnt at the same time his dis-
charge was - That after the Revolutionary war, he lived
about Seventeen years in North Carolina, then moved to
South Carolina, lived there about thirteen years, and
then moved to Kentucky, lived there about Ten years,
then moved to Green County Illinois, where he has
lived for the last ten years. That he is known to many
persons in his present Neighbourhood who can testify

Concerning him among whom he should mention Abner
Hill, Clergyman and Calvin Surrill, ^{John W. Moore & others} That he
hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension
or annuity Except the present and declares that his name
is not on the pension roll of the Agency of any State or Territory

This applicant has stated distinctly that his
Commissiions have been lost by fire, and at this remote
period he is not able to procure any testimony or proof of
their Existence - but he swears he served the periods
here to set forth in the capacity stated.
